FROM YOUR PASTOR



The memory of the baby Jesus may still be in the rearview mirror, but the road unfolds relentlessly towards his cross. The church's season of Lent preceding Easter offers opportunity for reflection on Jesus' suffering and death and what they mean for our own journeys of faith. We'll explore this theme through the lens of walking the road, covering familiar ground but also searching out new guideposts and practices along the way. As we come again into a political election season sure to be corrosive, we'll draw from Jesus' words calling us to humility and self-awareness as a helpful corrective.

Some people "give up" something for Lent, as a personal discipline. This can be a good way to increase mindfulness and focus. Poet Mary Oliver offers a perspective that invites us to give up certainty in favor of embracing the mystery of truth, of God, of spirit, in her poem *Mysteries, Yes*.

Truly, we live with mysteries too marvelous to be understood.

How grass can be nourishing in the mouths of the lambs.
How rivers and stones are forever in allegiance with gravity while we ourselves dream of rising.
How two hands touch and the bonds will never be broken.
How people come, from delight or the scars of damage, to the comfort of a poem.

Let me keep my distance, always, from those who think they have the answers.

Let me keep company, always, with those who say "Look!" and laugh in astonishment, and bow their heads.

Please keep company with your church as we walk the road of Lent together, beginning with Ash Wednesday (February 10) soup supper and prayer service, all the way through Easter, March 27.

Walking the Colorado Trail

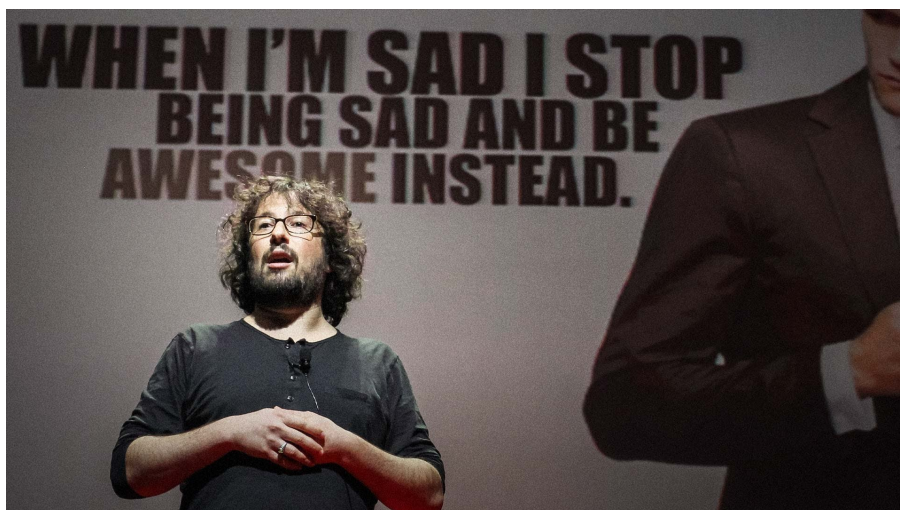
February 7

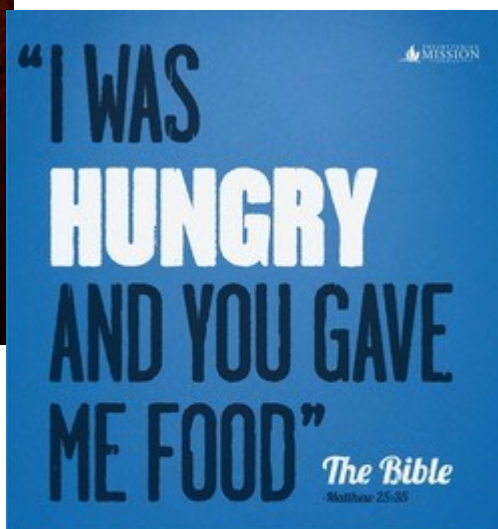


One Great Hour of Sharing
