

FROM YOUR **PASTOR**





Legacy of Dietrich Bonhoeffer

As part of our 2017-18 all-church theme 'Life Together,' based on the classic book on



Christian community by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, join us for worship on September 10 when **Al Staggs**, pastor and performing artist, will present his highly acclaimed, original one-person dramatization entitled *A View from the Underside: The Legacy of Dietrich Bonhoeffer.* He'll help us understand who Bonhoeffer was, and how he continues to speak to us today. Bonhoeffer is remembered as an outstanding 20th Century German theologian whose resistance to Hitler and the Nazi regime landed him in prison and eventually martyred, just days before V-E Day.

La Puente Trip

Over a period of four days, a group of families and individuals from Central journeyed to Alamosa, Colorado, to work with La Puente. La Puente is an organization dedicated to helping those in need in the rural San Luis Valley. The people in the valley live in poverty and hunger, and oftentimes, homelessness. La Puente has many branches, including PALS (Positive Activity Leads to Success) for children who have been neglected and abused. Part of our group went for two days to help and do activities with the kids. We played at parks and organized painting and other crafts. We were called 'Big Buddies' by the kids and made multiple connections with them. We will be thinking of the kids for a long time.

I met a little girl named Katina. Despite her clinging to me, I enjoyed helping her and playing with her. Her mother worked at Day's Inn and I never saw her father. She was five years old and a little bossy, but as I got to know her, I discovered that all she really needed was someone constant to give her attention. Maybe she wasn't receiving proper attention from her family, or maybe she was just the kind of person who needed the spotlight, but once she figured out my name she was holding my hand and insisting I sit next to her. Katina, I will keep you in my thoughts and prayers and hope you grow to become a wonderful person.

The rest of our group did work around the community. They built a covered structure in a garden and helped install garden boxes for two veterans to plant vegetables. Their work will encourage people to spend time outside and maintain gardens. Alamosa is a town in the middle of nowhere. It's run down but at the same time filled with life. People lived in rundown houses and trailers and many are homeless and/or unemployed. But with the help of our church and others, La Puente can achieve their many goals and help to improve the lives of those living under the poverty level in the San Luis Valley.

Central's chief assets include our magnificent building and outstanding staff. In April 2017, the Session adopted a new plan that supports the congregation's high-priority mission initiatives and utilizes the exceptional talents and commitment of the staff. The plan expanded positions held by **Joe Martell** and **Stephanie Fritz**, and addressed a long-standing need for greater administrative support. As we head into fall, here's a summary of the new plan, with areas of responsibility outlined for each position.



Director of Operations (FT)

Joe Martell moves into a more administrative role overseeing all building maintenance, functionality and improvements; coordinates use by outside groups; supervises administrative assistant and facilities assistant; manages church financials, coordinating with accountant Kathy Henkelman; serves as staff resource to Building and Property and Budget and Finance Committees; participates in the Capital Campaign Guidance Team; serves as liaison to New Genesis and Central Visitation Program.

Administrative Assistant (PT)

Kathleen Eckert - front desk reception, bulletin and Voice production, maintains church calendar, maintains church data base,



follows church brand guidelines in the production of marketing materials, annual report, weekly email blasts, website, and social media.



Facilities Assistant (PT)

Lou Scott - general custodial, maintenance, and security detail.

Director of Mission and Faith Formation (FT)

Stephanie Fritz coordinates hands-on mission including mission trips, Summer of Service, and year-round opportunities for service; serves as liaison to Central's mission partners and communicates their mission and needs; coordinates the four church-wide offerings and manages the mission budget; oversees learning experiences for all ages, including adults; serves as staff resource to Mission, Adult Education, and Children, Family, Youth Committees; supervises Youth Assistant and Children/Family Assistant (whether filled by one or two persons).



Children/Family Assistant (PT)

-search in process. Will carry out Sunday learning, fellowship, and service opportunities.

Youth Assistant (PT)

-search in process. Will carry out youth learning, fellowship, and service opportunities. Will assist the Pastor and Director of Mission/Faith Formation with confirmation.



Director of Music (FT)

Wil Smith leads an outstanding program of music ministries, choir, worship and special services, and community outreach; promotes visual arts in worship and in-house exhibits; primary point of contact with outside musical groups including the Denver Philharmonic Orchestra; with staff, develops communications and marketing strategies; supervises Music Assistant and Events

Coordinator; staff liaison to Music and Arts, Communication and Marketing Committees,

and participates on the Capital Campaign Guidance Team.

Music Assistant (PT)

Sarah Eaton directs the Children's Choir; rehearses chancel choir in Wil's absence; provides soprano section leadership.
